CONVENTION FOR THE EXTENSION OF HONGKONG,

(Signed at Peking, 9th June 1893.)

WHEREAS it has for many years past been re-商 cognised that an extension of Hongkong territory is necessary for the proper defence and protection of the

It has now been agreed between the Governments f Great Britain and China that the limits of British erritory shall be cularged under lease to the extent indicated generally on the annexed map. The exact boundaries shall be hereafter fixed when proper surveys have been made by officials appointed by the two Covernments. The term of this lease shall be minetynine years. It is at the same time agreed that within the city of Kowloon the Chinese officials now stationed there shall continue to exercise jurisdiction except so far as may be inconsistent with the military requirements for the defence of Hongkong. Within the remainder of the newly-leased territory Great Britain shall have sole jurisdiction. Chinese officials and people shall be allowed as heretofore to use the road from Kowloon to Hsinan.

Colony:

It is further agreed that the existing landing place near Kowloon city shall be reserved for the convenience of Chinese mea-of-war, merchant and assenger vessels, which may come and go and lie here at their pleasure; and for the convenience of movement of the officials and people within the city.

When hereafter China constructs a railway to the boundary of the Kowloon territory under British control, arrangements shall be discussed.

It is further understood that there will be no expropriation or expuision of the inhabitants of the district included within the extension, and that if land is required for public offices, fortifications, or the like official purposes, it shall be bought at a fair price.

If cases of extradition of criminals occur, they shall be dealt with in accordance with the existing Treaties between Great Britain and China and the Hongkong Regulations.

In witness whereof the undersigned, duly authorized thereto by their respective Governments, have signed the present Agreement.

Done at Peking in quadruplicate (four copies in English and four in Chinese) the ninth day of June in the year of Our Lord eighteen hundred and ninetyeight, being the twenty-first day of the fourth moon of the twenty-fourth year of Kuang Hsü.


