David Leigh, the Observer, has contacted us and raised five further points which he says will form the basis of a story in the continuing saga of Mark Thatcher, Cementation and Oman this Sunday:

- he put to Downing Street last week that he was proposing to say that Mrs Thatcher had raised the subject of his son and his association with Cementation during a conversation with the Sultan in Salalah. He wants to confirm that we are still offering no comment;
- he will refer to a company called Blake-Down Chipman with which Dennis Thatcher is associated, Cementation invited this company to bid for a land-scaping contract last year at the University.

 (When asked he said he was stating this as a matter of fact and not drawing any inference);
- he is going to say that Mark Thatcher might have got a commission payment of up to £1million on the deal. There has been no denial of suggestions in the press this week that MT received at least £350,000;
- he will say Cementation made payments to four Omani Government
 Ministers through a company called Sico. These payments totalled
 between £5-10million;
- he will say negotiations were held over the Oman contract between Downing Street and Tim Lamdon he is a middle-man in Omani circles.
- When asked to expand Leigh said that this man had meetings with MT and DT and he was involved in negotiations with officials over the Sultan's State Visit to London.
