Here is a list of possible issues that may come to a head in the near future :

- 1 <u>Jaguar privatisation</u> decision early February. Problem of private shareholders.
- 2 BL Trucks Division pending re-organisation and possible closures.
- British Shipbuilders on-going re-organisation and possible closures.
- British Steel Corporation decision on strip mills (unlikely to be fully resolved before Easter).
- 5 Post Office closure of one thousand counters in urban areas over the next 2-3 years.
- 6 Post Office tariff increases (but unlikely to be substantial).
- 7 <u>Direct Broadcasting Satellite</u> possible collapse of programme without BBC/IBA agreement.
- 8 ESPRIT need to resolve UK Government's position, and then need to obtain agreement with EC partners.
- 9 Trade relations with United States various problems, all of which seem likely to be exacerbated in run-up to presidential elections.
- 10 BT proposal for a joint venture with IBM for network services and BT's prospective purchase of IBM, instead of ICL, computers for its area computing systems.



The precise timing of most of these points is unclear, but all of these could become relevant in the period between now and Easter, although many of them could well be continuing problems thereafter.
