1. It had originally been proposed that the launch of our Manifesto, and therefore the first press conference at Central Office, should be held on Friday, 18th May. I was always a little concerned about this because Saturday is such a poor media day. The Chairman has now decided to hold the launch and press conference on the following Monday, 21st May.

4. Although you are speaking to the European candidates at dinner next week, this is months before the European elections. You have agreed in principle to address them at the launch of the campaign subject to diary. 5. And I have already made it clear that doing this speech on the same day as the press conference would mean that you would give an "off the cuff" short speech and <u>not</u> a major "on the record" speech. (There is merit in doing this apart from the normal reasons. Even now, with a number of Westminster contacts, the European MEPs drift off on their own. This is much more likely to happen after the elections when their Westminster links will be very badly eroded. We will have to use every means possible before and after the elections to try and keep them in line as far as possible.)

The pity about Monday, 21st May is, of course, that it does clash with your Netherlands-British Chamber of Commerce lunch.
