You have agreed the following programme to mark your fifth anniversary:

Friday, April 27: See Sunday Lobby, offering them

the text of a short speech (which

I am writing).

Monday, April 30: See full Lobby for briefing to

assist those writing assessments

of your first five years.

Friday, May 4: Photocall with short radio and TV

news interviews on your fifth

anniversary.

Sunday, May 6: BBC World this Weekend (Gordon Clough).

I do not wish to alter this. <u>But</u> I am under pressure from the party for you to give interviews to the Daily Star (supported by Tony Shrimsley); and the Sunday Mirror (Derek Howe).

My advice is as follows:

- i. So far as Sunday papers are concerned, the

 Mail on Sunday has also asked for an exclusive
 interview but I am simply not able to recommend you
 to do this in view of their performance over Mark/Oman.
- ii. Caroline says you could give the Sunday Mirror half anhour on Sunday April 27; it would then be up to them to get out of their half hour what the Sunday Lobby as a whole had not got earlier. Alternatively, you could abandon the Sunday Lobby and simply give an interview to the Sunday Mirror (which has not incidentally been at all helpful over Mark/Oman).
- iii. It was against this background that I proposed making use of the Sunday Lobby with a short hand-out speech to try to bend them to your will and get some pre-local elections publicity. The papers represented, apart from the Observer, Sunday Times and Mail on Sunday would be People, Sunday Mirror, News of the World, Sunday Telegraph. Sunday Express and Sunday Mail (Scotland).

Agree to stick to meeting with Sunday Lobby as a whole?

This would not, of course, preclude your seeing the Daily Star on say May 1 or 3 for a 5th Anniversary interview if you felt able to take this in addition to your agreed programme (see Annex I your diary that week).

Agree to see the Daily Star if it can be arranged in the week beginning April 30?
