The Prime Minister recorded this morning her contribution to the Impact '80s video. In the event it went well but there was a lot of time wasted by redrafting the text submitted by Central Office. As it happens, she had seen the draft text before Easter and again after Easter but I suppose inevitably only applied her mind to it probably this morning. The upshot is that she felt that she was served up an inadequate draft from Central Office.

I am writing so that you are aware of the situation in case the Prime Minister raises it with you at some stage.

But I also write with one constructive suggestion. Would it be possible for you to issue an instruction that every draft submitted from Central Office to the Prime Minister - for an article, speech, or recording - should, if it is not seen by you, be specifically and personally approved by the Head of the Department.

If you want to talk further about this I will, of course, be happy to do so.
