LESSONS OF THE MINERS STRIKE

The Group considered a Note by the Secretaries attached to which was a draw of the Group's second report to Ministers on the lessons of the miners strike (MISC 57(85) 12).

In discussion a number of drafting points were made.

THE CHAIRMAN, summing up the discussion, said that the aim was to finalise the report on Friday 15 November, and Departments should send any suggested amendments or revisions to the Secretaries by that date. He would aim to submit it to the erime Minister and the other Ministers concerned during the following week. He would ask them to take a note of the action which had been taken or was in fand, but he would not suggest that the Group should be asked to prepare a further specific follow-up Report unless Ministers asked for this: heaartments would, however, continue work on the recommendations identified in the first report.

The Prime Minister would be convening another meeting to discuss coal stocks and physical endurance during December, which would cover a number of points not dealt with in the Ground Record report.

The Group -

- 1. Took note, with approval, of the Chairman's summing up of their discussion.
- 2. Invited Departments to provide the Secretaries with any further amendments and revisions by 15 December.
- 3. Took note that the Chairman would be submitting the report to the Prime Minister and the other Ministers concerned during the following week.
